During this period of uncertainty, we're operating a flexible approach to bookings and contracts

We're on hand to offer support and guidance in understanding event restrictions and what they mean for you, to ensure the best experience for you and your guests





We undertake Covid-19 risk assessments specific to your event, so that we can all be confident that it is as safe as possible

We can easily adapt to changing situations and react to specific requests. For example, we offer pre-packaged food as well as traditional, takeaway and self-service catering





We offer virtual venue tours and planning meetings, as well as face-to-face site visits for small groups

We've introduced an enhanced training programme for every member of event staff, to maximise their safety as well as yours





Our chefs and kitchen staff have undertaken new training too, and follow strict food safety procedures

Our staff wear face coverings and we ensure this is strictly adhered to where legally required





We've introduced a new, enhanced cleaning and sanitising programme throughout our venues and guest facilities, paying specific attention to touch point areas

All used and unused tableware, condiments and linen will be removed and disinfected after guests have left





We will also disinfect all tables and chairs after each use

Hand sanitiser stations are available throughout our venues for you to use





We have implemented social distancing measures throughout our venues, with floor stickers, queue guidelines and one-way flow systems

Doorways will be left open where feasible to reduce touch points and improve air circulation





We can offer you use of additional, uncontracted space

We have a number of outdoor spaces available for events





We've reviewed our emergency and evacuation procedures, and adapted them to ensure social distancing is followed in the event of an emergency

We will manage any first aid incidents with the appropriate personal protective equipment

Below we present just a few of our flexible spaces to give you some ideas for your next event, whenever that may be.



Overlooking the River Mersey and with views of the iconic Three Graces, our outdoor terraces at the Museum of Liverpool are ideal for glamorous drinks receptions.

One of our clients even held a morning yoga class here!



On the opposite side of the Museum of Liverpool, you'll find more outdoor space at the entrance to the building. You can hire this area in conjunction with our atrium or cafe spaces, with outdoor catering available.

BBQs have been popular with some of our clients using this space in the past.



Over at Merseyside Maritime Museum, the outdoor Colonnades can be used for a range of events. There's also a space on the top floor of the Museum that's ideal for small, socially distanced gatherings.

Whatever space you choose, your guests will enjoy unbeatable views across the Royal Albert Dock.



The largest space in our portfolio, the Lower Horseshoe at World Museum is ideal for social distancing.

Its unique long shape can be used to create distance between each of your guests, or to make breakout spaces for smaller groups.



Another flexible area for events inside World Museum can be found on the ground floor, where we have three adjacent spaces.

The unusual layout is ideal for ensuring safe distances between guests, and various entry and exit points can be coordinated to manage guest movement.



Over in Port Sunlight on the Wirral, the main hall inside the Lady Lever Art Gallery - filled with paintings and sculptures - also has various access points to manage the flow of your guests.

Additionally, its length allows you to easily create space between each person.
